Maine Voters Stay, as Usual, On G.O.P. Side

Republicans Winning All Major Margins By Henry Morgan

Republican Gov. Frederick C. Phillips and Rep. Frank Feltus, Republican of the third district, voted to victory in yesterday's Maine election, the country's first since the Korean war.

With two other G.O.P. congressmen in commanding leads, the Republican majority was making an eighth straight "clean sweep" of major offices, Republicans called the election the nation's first test of confidence in the Truman administration's handling of the Korean and Chinese situations.

Feltus' battle was on "this horrible, hanging, ugly" administration.

WINS SECOND TERM

Phillips won his second term with more than a 2 to 1 margin over the other side of his opponent. In 263 of the state's 623 precincts an official tabulation gave him 58,770 votes. Earl G. Grant, Democrat, polled 27,683 and Leonard E. Feltus, State Representative, 20,000. Feltus defeated John V. Kennedy, a Democrat of the House of Representatives, who served in the United States House of Representatives for 11 years.

U. N. Rejects Soviet Demand For Red China Invitation to Back Up Charges Against the United States

LAKE SUCCESS, Sept. 11 (AP)—By a margin of one vote, the United Nations Security Council today turned down a Russian demand that Red China be invited here to back up its charges of aggression against the United States.

The Russian charge was filed in such charges, one alleged U. S. air forces have invaded Manchuria and dropped bombs, the other that the United States invaded the Korean territory when it sent the Seventh Fleet to patrol the Strait of Formosa.

Chief U. S. Delegate Warren Austin labeled these charges "a trick" inspired by Russia to divert attention from the real aggression in Korea. The move to invite Red China to send a representative to the Security Council, he said, was "a transparent attempt to smother such a representative under any guise."

"We must oppose most strongly any attempt to turn the Security Council into a propaganda machine, or to use it as an excuse to enter the Security Council by the back door," Austin said. The vote on the Soviet proposal was 5 to 4, with the United States and seven other nations in the affirmative votes.

Lineup with Russia were China, Soviet Union, Poland, Czechoslovakia and India. The United States, Nationalist China and China voted against the proposal. Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Jacob A. Malik argued that Nationalist China and the United States had invited the United States to back up its charges against the United States.

Allies Roil For Back Slightly on Northeast Front

TOKYO, Sept. 12 (Tuesday)—A rumbling artillery duel raged the front lines of the Korean peninsula today as United Nations forces rolled the enemy back slowly along the northeastern front from Yungju to the east coast.

While Air Force attacks in recent centuries kept the enemy off balance and delayed the climax of the drive on Targu, South Korean U. N. troops scored success in the northeast.

The U. N. gains were limited, however, and reports on the allied progress were slumpy.

The largest gains were made by the South Koreans in the area of Yungju, which was less than a week ago was held solely by the Communists. The Eighth Army command said the South Koreans had built up a firm base around Yungju.

The Communists said the South Koreans advanced from slightly more than 100 miles to more than 200 miles. North Korean wireless said the Communists were capturing the northern front of east Yungju, and one red force of the remnants of two regiments was trapped southeast of Puhang.

There was speculation that the allies might retake Puhang and the town. The Communists were reported to be preparing to leave, probably in the next few days.
